



THE CHALLENGE: YOUTH UNEMPLOYMENT


Globally, 66.6 million young women and men are unemployed.



YOUTH UNEMPLOYMENT RATES BY COUNTRY


THE CHALLENGE: YOUTH NEET

- The proportion of youth NEET reached 22% world-wide.
- Women are disproportionally more affected in emerging (80.3%) and developing (66.1%) economies than in developed ones (55.7%).



THE CHALLENGE: WORKING POVERTY


144.9 million young workers in emerging and developing countries are living in extreme or moderate poverty.






